

Ontario Child and Youth Telepsychiatry Program

Woodview

Services Available:

Direct Consultation: Child, family and case manager meet with a child psychiatrist via videoconferencing in Brant; one time consultation; assessments, diagnosis, medication review, treatment recommendations; follow-up report sent to case manager (and physician if involved)

Indirect Consultation – clinicians to psychiatrist, includes program centered consultations

Education training - professional development for Mental Health Providers, educational seminars, hospital grand rounds

Referral Process:

Case manager via Woodview to Telepsychiatry's Western Hub; BCFPI, CAFAS, reports, referral package requested. Does NOT require physician referral.

Approximate Wait Time:

Up to 1 month (2 weeks average)

Other Information:

- Child psychiatrists have expertise in children's mental health issues and dual diagnosis (developmental disability and mental health issues)
- Provincial initiative that supports timely, local access to child psychiatrists

Child Psychiatry is available in Brant for children and youth ages 0 – 18, through both **direct consultation** where the child psychiatrists meet with the child and family, as well as **indirect consultation** where the child psychiatrists meet with children's services clinicians and/or physicians.

There are no service fees.

Child Psychiatry services are available to Brant children, families, physicians and service providers (including Six Nations and New Credit) through:

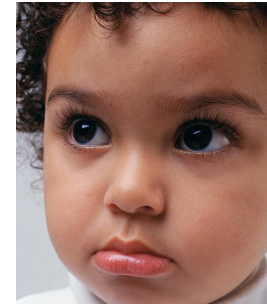

Which service to choose?
Consider family's personal preference, the expertise required and complexity of issues, direct or indirect consultation, and referral source (physician, family, or children's services case manager)

Child and Parent Resource Institute (CPRI)

Services Available:

Direct Consultation: Child and family meet with a child psychiatrist in London, ON; one time consultation; assessments, diagnosis, medication review, treatment recommendations; follow-up report sent to physician.

Referral Process:

1. Service request via CPRI Intake office requires a physician's referral
- or
2. Family or Case Manager via Contact Brant – medical information will be required from the child's doctor

Approximate Wait Time:

Varies by client

Other Information:

- Child psychiatrists have expertise in children's mental health issues and dual diagnosis (mental health and developmental disability)
- Child psychiatrists are attached to other CPRI programs
- Tertiary level service – local services should be considered first; access when need specific expertise, to address complex needs, or if linked to other CPRI services

Regional Child and Youth Mental Health Service (Outreach)

McMaster Children's Hospital

Services Available:

Indirect Consultation: Child psychiatry team (child psychiatrist, advanced practice nurse, social worker) meet in Brant with children's services clinicians and physician to review case and make recommendations re assessments, treatment, diagnosis (and recommendations re medication if physician attending/requesting); follow-up report sent to case manager.

Referral Process:

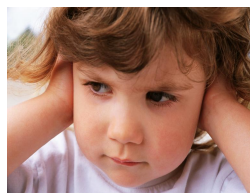
Case Manager via Contact Brant; professionals (physician, children's services, school, etc.) involved with the child will be invited to the consultation.

Approximate Wait Time:

Indirect Consultation meets in Brant the third Wednesday afternoon of each month

Other Information:

- Dr. Kathy Macdonald is currently the child psychiatrist attached to the Regional Team serving Brant
- Tertiary service



Dr. David Templeman's Clinic at St. Leonard's Community Services

Services Available:

Direct Consultation: Child and family meet with the child psychiatrist in Brant for a one time consultation which includes assessment, diagnosis, medication review, treatment recommendations; follow-up report sent to referring physician

Referral Process:

Physician to physician via St. Leonard's Community Services' Addictions and Mental Health; Parent Referral package must be completed by parents/guardian and dropped off at 133 Elgin St. prior to the appointment being scheduled.

Approximate Wait Time:

Up to 1 month (2 weeks average)

Other Information:

- Clinic one day per week in Brantford provides service to Brant, Haldimand and Norfolk in partnership with BCHS and St. Leonard's Community Services
- Expertise in pediatric bi-polar
