Who we are...

St. Leonard's Community Services' Justice Services provide client centred, community based and residential environments that provide strength based individual and group focused education, assessment and counselling to youth and adults involved in the legal system.

Our knowledgeable staff consists of child and youth and social service counsellors, law and security, corrections, recreation, volunteers and consulting psychiatric, social work, addictions, mental health services. We also work with other agencies and professionals in the community to enhance service coordination, assessment, treatment/action and discharge planning.

What we offer...

Residential Services:

The Peter Willis Residence accommodates male clients aged 12 – 17 years who are being held on a detention order or an open custody warrant via the Youth Criminal Justice Act. Services are provided 24/7 and include an on site Learning Centre, employment, group programs, community service and recreation.

The Buffalo Street Residence is a residential substance abuse program that accommodates up to 11 male federal offenders on Day Parole, Statutory Release and Unescorted Temporary Absences (UTA's). The program provides clients with the skills and supports they need to lead a productive, pro-social lifestyle.

Community-based Services:

Community justice services are available to youth and adults.

The goal is to provide supportive interventions and programming to assist clients in accepting responsibility for their offence and addressing the impact of their actions on themselves, their family, the victim and the community.

What clients can expect...

The first step is **Referral**. Referrals are received from the Court, local Police Services, Ontario Provincial Police Services, detention/custody facilities, Probation Services and Correctional Services of Canada. We will gather information to help clients decide if any of the programs and/or Agency programs meet their needs. We can also refer to other community agencies.

During **Intake**, clients are oriented to programs and services.

The next step is **Assessment**. Clients meet with a Counsellor to help identify strengths and needs. The Counsellor then takes all of the information and puts it into a report. After the client reviews the assessment report, the client and Counsellor work together to develop a **treatment/action plan**.

The treatment/action plan identifies:

- Client goal(s) – what do they want to change.
- Planned Outcomes – what change will look like.
- Planned Activities – the steps that will help the client make those changes.
- Resources – who and what are going to help the client.
- Outcome Indicators – how the client will know if things are getting better.
- Measurement Methods – how we will measure whether things are getting better.

The final step of treatment planning is **discharge** planning. Towards the end of service, the Counsellor reviews with the client progress made and discusses **aftercare/follow-up supports**.
